Practical information

Location

The meeting of 12th will be held in a conference room at “Tunisia Export-CEPEX”, which is 5km to the airport and 5km to the city center (400m to INRAT and INRGREF for those who have been already there).

All the suggested hotels are in 5-10km radius around the conference place, which makes it easy to reach. As mentioned above CEPEX is located at “Centre Urbain Nord - BP 225, 1080 Tunis

The second day of the event will be held in the region of Tabarka (180 km from the capital). It will combine a Science to practice Seminar (morning session) followed by a Field trip. The field trip will include several stops to visit local stakeholders and It will end with the lunch break.

Arrival and Accommodation

It's recommended that you plan your arrival on November 11th, 2019. You should be arriving to Tunis-Carthage Airport (please do not book flights arriving to other airports).

The airport is located at 15/30mn from the city center of Tunis.

Several hotel are close to the airport and to the conference place, however we highly recommend:

- Golden Tulipe Mechtel for 133euro/night
- IBIS Hotel for 113euro/night
- Ariha Hotel for less than 30euro/night

There are normal taxi (yellow) and the touristic taxi (white) queuing in front of the airport, you should reach your hotel in 20-30mn if you choose one of the mentioned above hotels (it also depend on the trafic)

Practical information

***Visa and passports**

Please bring your passports, it may be required. Usually there are no visa requirements for European citizen. If you are not European or you have any doubts, please contact the closest Tunisian embassy or consulate.

***Currency change**

The local currency used in Tunisia is the Tunisian National Dinar (TND) (1 TND = 0,31 EUR) .
